

Supporting children in receipt of Targeted Pupil Premium or Ever6 – Information for Parents and Carers for September 2026

For children in receipt of Targeted Pupil Premium/Ever6*, the school receives some additional funding to help support each child's attainment progress, attendance, engagement and enjoyment of school. It is not a 'pot of money' for each individual child although we do look carefully at each child's needs. As a school, we use our Pupil Premium money to help provide things like Lunchbunch, Pastoral Support, learning support, resources and training.

In addition, we believe that it is really important to offer families in receipt of Targeted Pupil Premium/Ever6 access to wider opportunities such as trips, clubs and residential. In the past the school has spent much more money on Targeted Pupil Premium/Ever 6 expenditure than the school received. We are no longer in a financial position to do this as a school and so, unfortunately, we have had to introduce some changes from September 2026.

Please see the table below which explains what we are able to support your child and family with:

Activity	Targeted Pupil Premium subsidy	Notes
Day trips and events which are part of the curriculum (includes things like Roman/ Saxon Days etc)	No charge to parents. Full cost paid by school	Please still complete the consent Forms when they are sent out.
Residential visits in Year 4 and Year 6	For Year 4 , the school will pay 30% of the cost. For Year 6 , the school will pay 70% of the cost. If your child chooses not to go on the residential trip and stays at school, the school will fully fund any 'home based' activities.	The subsidy is fixed, if your child does not attend Year 4 trip, it will still be 70% in Year 6. Any parents who might be facing significant hardship in relation to the residential visits, even with the reduction, are encouraged to contact Mrs Dunn in confidence at the earliest opportunity.
School clubs run by external companies.	The school will pay 50% of the termly club charge for one club per term.	Parents book online via early notification. Parents are responsible for paying 50% of the charges direct to the Club provider. Failure to pay may result in the club offer being withdrawn. If children change their mind and stop attending, the school reserves the right not to pay for future clubs.
School clubs run by teachers, including Choir, recorders, Tag rugby, team football.	No charge to parents. Full cost paid by the school.	Please book once club details are shared. If children change their mind and stop attending, the school reserves the right to offer the place to other children.
HAF Holiday activities	No charge – fully funded by HCC	Book here HAF Parent Hub Health and social care Hampshire County Council
