


Could you be eligible for a grant for your home?

There are thousands of pounds worth of funds available through national grant schemes that could help make your home warmer and reduce your energy bills.



- You are on certain means-tested bene its
- Your house is poorly insulated
- You are off-gas for heating with a household income under £36,000
- You are upgrading a boiler



Available grants for your home

Are you on certain means-tested benefits?

The **Energy Company Obligation** could provide a discount or free upgrades such as insulation or upgrading your heating system.

Who's eligible? Homeowners or tenants who are on certain means-tested benefits such as Universal Credit with a home that has an energy rating of D (homeowners only), E, F and G.

Is your house poorly insulated?

The **Great British Insulation Scheme** could provide single measure upgrades such as loft or wall cavity insulation at a discount or for free.

Who's eligible? Homeowners or tenants with a home that has an energy rating of D-G and Council Tax band A-D.



Are you <u>not</u> gas heated with a household income under £36,000?

The Home Upgrade Grant could provide an average £18,000 worth of upgrades including a full home assessment (and Energy Performance Certificate if needed).

Are you upgrading a boiler?

The **Boiler Upgrade Scheme** could provide up to £7,500 towards a low-carbon heating replacement such as an air source heat pump.
