First write each word in pencil. Then trace over each word three times. Each time you trace, use a **DIFFERENT** colour crayon. Trace neatly and you will see a rainbow!

Hidden Words

Draw and colour a picture. Hide your spelling words inside your picture. Show your picture to someone and see if they can find your hidden words!

Silly Sentences

Write silly sentences using a spelling word in each sentence. Please underline your spelling words! Write neatly!

Example: My dog <u>wears</u> a blue and purple dress when he takes a bath.

Backwards Words

Write your spelling words forwards and then backwards. Write neatly!

Example: where

erehw

Pyramid Writing

"Pyramid write" your spelling words. Remember to write neatly!

*<u>Example</u>: home h

ho hom

Create an Activity

Can you think of a really fun way to practise your spelling words? Then go for it!

Be sure to explain your activity so that you can share it with the class!

ABC Order

First write your spelling words in a list. Then write them in alphabetical order.

If that's too easy, write your words in reverse alphabetical order!

Story, Story

Write a story using ALL of your spelling words. Be sure to underline your spelling words in your paragraph.

Draw and Laber

Draw and label your spelling words. You MUST colour your drawings and labels.

Don't forget to add a lot of great detail! Do your very best work!

Blue Vowels!

Write each of your spelling words.

You will need a blue coloured pencil. **Trace over the vowels in each** word with your blue coloured pencil.

Vowels = a e i o u

Squiggly Spelling Words

First write your spelling words in regular letters. Then write the words again in squiggly letters!

Bubble Letters

Write your spelling words in bubble letters. After you write your words in bubble letters, colour your words with a coloured pencil.

Bubble Letters Rock!

Three Times!

Write each spelling word three times. First, write each word in pencil. Second, write each word in crayon. Third, write each word in marker. You MUST write neatly!

Adding My Words

Each letter has a value. *Consonants are worth 10. *Vowels are worth 5. Write your spelling words. Then add up the value of each spelling word. <u>Example</u>-Said - 10 + 5 + 5 + 10 = 30

Acrostic Poem

Choose one of your spelling words. Write an acrostic poem for that word.

You must also ILLUSTRATE your poem.

*<u>Example</u>: fly Fun in the sky. Laps around clouds. Yes! I'm free!

Superman Letter

Your job is to write a creative letter to Superman (or another super hero).

In your letter, you must use each of your spelling words. Be sure to <u>underline</u> your words as you use them.

Spelling Shapes

Count your spelling words. Draw one shape for each word. Then write your spelling words inside each of the shapes.

<u>Examples</u>:

Spelling Poem

Write a poem using several of your spelling words. <u>Underline</u> the words that you use. Illustrate your poem.

scrambled Words

Fold a piece of paper three times lengthwise (making three long rectangular columns). Write your words in the first column. Then write them again with the letters all mixed up (scrambled) in the second column. Put your words aside. Come back later to unscramble your words. Write the unscrambled words in the third column.

Consonant Circle

Write each of your spelling words.

Then go back and circle all of the consonants in your words!

Don't forget to write neatly!

Vowel Circle

Write each of your spelling words.

Then go back and circle all of the vowels in your spelling words!

Don't forget to write neatly!

Buzzing Bees







Write your spelling words in the air using your finger. Have a partner read your words as you write them OR have a partner air write and your job is to read the words.

Back Writing


Use your finger to spell out each of your spelling words, one letter at a time, on someone else's back.

Good, Clean Words

Ask an adult to help you find a flat surface that can be cleaned easily. Spray a small amount of shaving cream and spread it out. Write your spelling words in the shaving cream and be sure to clean up afterwards!



Ask an adult to help you find somewhere outside to draw a hopscotch board with chalk. Write letters instead of numbers and HOP your words!

Magazine Words

Use an old magazine and find your words (or the letters that make up your word).

Cut them out and glue on your paper.

Write a friendly letter to a friend or family member using each of your words. Underline the spelling words that you use in your letter.

When your teacher has seen it, you can post your letter.

Write each of your words on two different index cards. Turn all the cards face down and

mix them up. Lay out your cards in rows and turn over two cards at a time. Read each card aloud to see it they match. Keep them if they match or turn them over and try again!

Sentence, Pleaso

Write sentences using each of your spelling words. You may use more than one word in a sentence.

Underline your spelling words.

Surround Words

Write your words out. Draw a box shape around the words, following the shape of the ascenders (eg t, l, h, b, d, k) and descenders (g, y, j, p).

Spelling Flowers

Draw a big picture of a flower. Write each of your spelling words on one of the flower petals or on a leaf. Draw extra flowers if you run out of room.

Telephone Words

First, write your words in a list. Then look at a telephone keypad. Translate each letter into the numbers on the keypad. Now write your spelling words using this code! Toss (or roll) a ball back and forth with a partner. You say the 1st letter, and then toss and your partner says 2nd letter, and so forth.

Loss a Word

Type 'Em

Type your spelling words on the computer. *Make each word have a different font.*

Word Search

Make a word search puzzle using your spelling words then ask a friend to find the words OR ask someone else to make the puzzle and you find the words.

Trace Around

Write each of your spelling words using a pencil. Then trace around each word with a crayon, coloured pencil, or a marker.

Newsy Words

Write each spelling word and then write at least two words made from the same letters that is hidden inside the word. *Example:* slide side lie lid led *etc*.

Use old magazines, catalogues or newspapers to cut out letters. Glue the letters down on a piece of paper to spell your words.

Other Handed

First, write your spelling words the way you usually do it. Then, try writing the list with your other hand! Pasta Words Arrange alphabet pasta form your spelling words. Glue onto a piece of paper. Once you think you have learned your words, ask someone to test you. Check your practice test and correct any misspelt words.

oractice Tess

Spelling Baseball

Draw four bases on a piece of paper or lay out four pillows to be the bases. The bowler selects a word. If the batter can spell the word correctly, they move forward one base.

Sound Words

Use a tape recorder to record your spelling words and their spelling. Then rewind your tape and listen to it, checking to see that you spelt all the words correctly.

Words Without Consonants Write your spelling words on a list, but replace all the consonants with a line. Then go back to the beginning of your list and see if you can fill in the correct missing consonants.

Practise your spelling words in Spelling Bee style. Spell your words out loud to someone else.

Spelling Flashcards

Make a set of flashcards to practise your spelling words. When you look at your flashcard, read the word and then spell it out loud.

**Example-* there t-h-e-r-e.

Words Without Vowels

Write your spelling words on a list, but replace all the vowels with a line. Then go back to the beginning of your list and see if you can fill in the correct missing vowels.

Make Some Music

Write a song or rap that includes your words! Share with a friend or family member.

Morse Code

Use Morse Code or make up your own code to spell your words.



In a darkened room, use a torch to write your spelling words in the air. Have a partner read your words as you write them OR your partner can "torch write" the words and your job is to read. scrabble

Use Scrabble tiles to spell out your spelling words. For a little extra maths practise, calculate the value of each of your words!



Ask an adult to find somewhere where you can spray a small amount of whipped cream (or anything else you can eat) on a plate and spread it out.

Write your spelling words and be sure to clean up afterwards.
